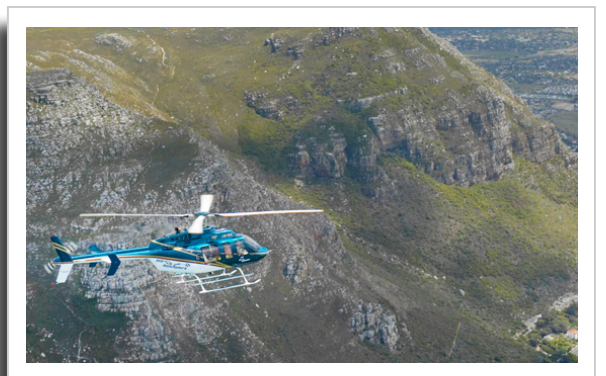

Itinerary:

Day 1

Guests arrive at OR Tambo International Airport in Johannesburg in the morning. A VIP meet and greet service will be available as guests disembark the planes. Further assistance will also be given as they pass through customs and also be escorted through to the luggage carousels.

Zar Travel Services representative will meet guests as they pass through the security gates. Guests will be escorted through to the waiting vehicles to the nearby private departure lounge for the charter flight to the Sabi Sabi Airstrip.

While guests wait for their charter planes to depart, a surprise performance by a local children's choir will welcome guests to this amazing country. Refreshments will be served while guests wait for their departure.

The flight duration from ORTIA to the Sabi Sabi Airstrip will be approximately 50 minutes.

Flight enhancements:

We recommend additional refreshments to be served on board the flights as well as special headrest covers displaying the company logo.

On arrival at the Sabi Sabi Airstrip, guests will be met by the lodge staff and an impressive site awaits guests as all the game drive vehicles will be ready for their departure to the lodge. On arrival at the lodge, guests will be served a welcome drink while their luggage is distributed to their rooms.

LUNCH:

Lunch will also be served in the Lodge Restaurant and guests are free to enjoy this at their leisure. Afterwards, guests will have the remainder of the afternoon to enjoy the lodge facilities.

Late afternoon, guests will meet in the lounge for afternoon tea before departing for their evening game drive, trying to spot the Big 5, Sundowners will be enjoyed in the bush.

Sabi Sand Private Reserve is situated in an area that has the greatest diversity of wildlife in Africa. With no barrier between the reserve and Kruger National Park the game viewing is simply spectacular.

DINNER: Boma at Lodge

Returning to Lodge the group has time to refresh, until they regroup around the campfire for a Boma Dinner.

The blast of a kudu horn will announce dinner in the open-air boma, under the stars, around a roaring log fire.

After dinner retire to the bar area and relax in front of the roaring fire. Your ranger will escort you back safely to your suite where you have the opportunity of enjoying a relaxing night's sleep.

Day 2

An early morning call from the Ranger will wake you before first light, while the kitchen brews hot coffee or tea, and prepares cool fruit juices with a muffin, rusk or other freshly made delicacy. So begins the morning safari.

The bush is already alive, the air filled with birdsong as the rising sunlight dances off beads of dew on spiders' webs. Nobody, not even the tracker who can read the bushveld like a book, knows what's in store. He will watch the road for spoor, leaning forward intently to find any print left by a predator during its hunt in the dark.

BREAKFAST

Returning to the lodge they will enjoy a scrumptious breakfast, where after they have the morning & the afternoon (only meeting for lunch at the lodge) to enjoy the lodges facilities.

OPTIONAL ACTIVITY: SPA TREATMENTS

Guests can indulge in a relaxing massage, or an exotic treatment with a very African flavour.

In the afternoon they meet again for their game drive.

LUNCH:

Lunch will also be served in the Lodge Restaurant and guests are free to enjoy this at their leisure. Afterwards, guests will have the remainder of the afternoon to enjoy the lodge facilities.

DINNER: Bush

Tonight the group will be surprised, as instead of returning to the lodge after the game drive, they will stop in the middle of the bush, where dinner has been set up. As an optional enhancement, drummers will welcome guests as they approach the dinner site. Guests can also be entertained by African Dancers during dinner. Furthermore, we can also arrange for an Astrologer to be available during dinner who will educate guests on the beauty of the African Skies.

Day 3

Again after an early morning wake up call & game drive, the group will have breakfast and then check out of the lodge.

They will be transferred to the Sabi Sabi Airstrip for their flight to Johannesburg and then on to the Cape Town. Zar Travel Services representative will assist guests with all the check-in formalities and luggage movements in Johannesburg with this connecting flight.

Coaches and Zar Travel Services representatives will greet the group in Cape Town and transfer them onto their hotel.

On arrival at the hotel, guests will be escorted to a private check-in area and will enjoy a welcome drink and check in. Guests will be at leisure for the remainder of the afternoon. In true African spirit, we recommend local ladies dressed in traditional outfits to welcome guests to the Mother City, Cape Town. These women will hand out beaded gifts to all the ladies in the group as a small welcome.

Late afternoon, guests will have sundowners on the terrace at the hotel, before departing to the V&A Waterfront for dinner.

DINNER: Restaurant (V&A Waterfront)

With sweeping terraces that offer spectacular views of Table Mountain and harbour, lives up to its name in every way. Chic and contemporary, the restaurant scene at Victoria and Alfred Waterfront, large range of menus serving signature selection of dishes and fabulous fare in a glorious setting that welcomes visitors to Cape Town in style.

Day 4

After breakfast the group departs on the City Tour with a difference.

What better way to experience the city than a short city tour, providing guests with the option to interact with the local people, tasting some of the local delicacies?

Guests will be transferred for a short overview and historical background of the city, before stopping for a short walk through the city centre. This is however a tour with a difference. We provide guests with the option of meeting some of the local people, each representing a different cultural group. At each meeting, these locals will also offer guests the opportunity to taste something unique, all making up the huge diversity of Cape Town. This activity is especially designed to be not too strenuous and suitable for all fitness levels.

Guests will be dropped off in the traditional Cape Malay area of the BO-KAAP. We will have various guides to escort smaller groups through this area, making this a far more interactive experience. It is a multicultural area, tucked safely into the fold of signal hill. Use the cobblestoned streets as your guide and you will be led into a lively suburb filled with brightly colored houses from the nineteenth and seventeenth century, Muslim saints shrines and many beautiful Mosques including the first established Muslim Mosque in South Africa. The inhabitants of Bo-Kaap are proud of their rich cultural heritage. They were mostly descendants of slaves which were imported by the Dutch back in the 1700's. Here, guests will have the opportunity to taste local treats like samoosas, pakora or daltjies...

Afterwards, it is a short walk to the heart of the city. Guests will walk through the vibrant LONG STREET. A brief stop at a local African Restaurant will provide guests the opportunity to taste more traditional Xhosa treats. From there, guests continue to the Cape Town's oldest and most popular markets, GREEN MARKET SQUARE. The cobblestone square has a wide variety of African curios, clothing, candles and speciality stands. The history of the market dates back to when ships passing the Cape would use the area for trading their goods and stocking up on produce before they continued along on their voyages. You will find that the market is always alive with people and has a great atmosphere and sense of character about it.

Lastly, guests will continue the short walk to the COMPANY GARDENS, past the Houses of Parliament. The Company Gardens, located at the upper end of Adderley street, with its stately oak trees, shady paths, green lawns and lily covered ponds has a direct line of descent from the earliest settlers. When Jan Van Riebeck landed in the Cape in 1652, his first task was to plant a vegetable garden to supply the passing ships of his

employers, the powerful Dutch East India Company. The modern Gardens are located at this spot and although much reduced from the original size are still a wonderful place to spend a few hours. The city of Cape Town, despite not being the capital of South Africa, is home to South Africa's Parliament - Cape Town is the legislative capital, whilst the seat of government is in Pretoria, the administrative capital. The parliament building itself, which also houses the Library of Parliament, is beautiful, with its central dome and Corinthian porticos and pavilions. The original designer, Charles Freeman, miscalculated the foundations and was replaced by Henry Greaves, who oversaw the building until completion in 1885. The new House of Assembly was designed by Sir Herbert Baker. While walking through the Company Gardens, guests will have the opportunity to taste and meet some of the locals who originated from Dutch / European regions. Snacks, reflecting their cultural influence will be enjoyed in the Company Gardens.

At the end of the City Tour they will stop at the base of the Table Mountain, taking the cable car to the summit. At the top sparkling wine & orange juice will await the group, where they can toast the spectacular views over Camp's Bay. With the cable car the group will return to the base of the mountain and then transferred to their lunch venue.

Lunch : Restaurant on beach front at Camps Bay beach

The Restaurants are situated overlooking the white sands, palm trees and sun revelers of Camps Bay beach, the perfect place to witness first hand the beauty of the Cape in a magnificent venue, while enjoying your lunch

After lunch, guests will transfer to the hotel situated at Victoria and Alfred Waterfront, for time for relaxation until dinner.

A Hospitality Desk will be available to assist with any recommendations the passengers may need.

DINNER: Selection of Restaurants

Vibrant night life, from stunning selection of restaurants simply oozes glamour from every pore. A spacious dance floor and a live band every evening, ensures that they offer the very best in dinner choices. The menus focus from continental and traditional specialities. The shellfish - prawns, langoustines, lobster, and of the course the Seafood Platters, are all highly recommended with tried and tested recipes that ensure that the shellfish is cooked to perfection. And for the more adventures the African traditional cousin is not to be missed.

Day 5

After breakfast the group departs on the Cape Peninsula Tour.

Cape Point Nature Reserve is perhaps the most scenically spectacular park in South Africa. It stretches over the buckling, fynbos-covered hills of the Cape Peninsula to the dramatic Cape of Storms. Cape Point itself is one of the greatest landmarks in the world, jutting like a rocky knife into the broiling Atlantic ocean. It was here that Bartholomew Diaz, the Portuguese navigator, first rounded the Cape in 1488, searching for a trade route to India and the East. The large stone cross in the reserve commemorates his achievement. Having narrowly avoided being shipwrecked by the Cape's famously unpredictable weather, Diaz named it Cabo Tormentosa, or Cape of Storms. More than 600 ships have sunk on its shores. Portuguese King John was so elated to learn of the sea route to India that he renamed it Cabo de boa Esperança, or Cape of Good Hope. The reserve protects many endangered animal and plant species, including four whale species, three dolphin species, four tortoise species, 250 bird species, and a staggering 1016 species of fynbos. (But this is a mere 12% of the 8200 species of fynbos – 'fine bush' – found in the Cape, which form the smallest and richest of the world's six floral kingdoms.) Brown and white bontebok antelopes, dawdling tortoises and dashing ostriches can be also seen on a drive through the pristine Cape Point Nature Reserve.

LUNCH: RESTAURANT

In the Cape, just en-route to Cape Point, this ensures the perfect setting for an idyllic lunch experience. During "whale season", our guests often enjoy their meal whilst watching whales sidling along the coastline. The selection of restaurants along the coast offer an attentive service and incredible views.

ALTERNATIVE LUNCH:

Picnic at Cape Point Nature Reserve

The group is welcomed on the beach with a Glass of Champagne before being lead to tables, which have been spaciouly spread out on rolling green lawns and covered by a beautiful Bedouin tent to provide shade and shelter from the elements. While relaxing under the Bedouin guests will be able to take in the scenic views of Cape Hangklip, False Bay and maybe even catch a glimpse of some whales frolicking in the Indian Ocean. Once everyone has enjoyed a leisurely lunch waiters will walk amongst the guests checking on drinks and making sure everyone is seen to.

After lunch the group will investigate the Penguins at Boulders Beach after which they return to their hotel.

DINNER: GOLD RESTAURANT (City Centre)

Unique in the world and located in the historic Martin Melck House in Cape Town, South Africa, The Gold of Africa museum complex is the world's first Museum to African gold, its heritage and traditional goldsmithing skills. The heart of the Museum is one of the largest and most beautiful collections of African gold artefacts, the Barbier-Mueller collection, which is displayed in an inspiring and dynamic environment.

Set in a strikingly restored landmark building, the museum complex is a hive of activity, filled with dazzling gold, traditional African goldsmiths, audio visual presentations on Africa's gold heritage, refreshments accompanied by fine South African wines and exquisite items for sale, not available elsewhere in Cape Town!

After dinner, guests will return to their hotel. For those guests who are keen on experiencing Cape Town's nightlife, guides and transport can be arranged in order to assist guests with exploring the musical side of the city's nightlife.

Day 6**After breakfast the group departs on the Cape Wineland Day.****Stellenbosch**

Governor Simon Van der Stel established Stellenbosch as a frontier town on the banks of the Eerste Rivier in 1679. It is the second oldest town in South Africa (after Cape Town itself), and one of the best preserved. The town is full of architectural and historical gems featuring Cape Dutch, Georgian and Victorian style. Due to its large number of oaks, the town is still referred to as the 'Eikestad' (City of oaks). There are several interesting museums of which the Village (Dorp) Museum, which consists of four buildings dating from 1709 to 1850, is a good example. Stellenbosch is famous for its university, established in 1918. Being the first Afrikaans language institution to be created in South Africa, the university still plays an important role in Afrikaner politics and culture. Stellenbosch is also the core of the vineyards of the Cape region.

Franschhoek

Franschhoek was named after the French Huguenots who settled here at the end of the 17th Century. The Huguenots were French Protestants who fled from religious persecution after the revoking of the Edict of Nantes in 1685. At that time, the Dutch East India Company, wanting to strengthen the Cape settlement, announced that "French Huguenots, especially those having a knowledge in vine culture, vinegar and spirits making" would be more than welcome. After a long journey by boat, about 200 French Huguenots arrived in a valley surrounded by mountains called Drakenstein and Olifantshoek (the elephant corner). It was soon renamed Franschhoek (the French corner).

Suggested Wine Estates for wine tasting:**Boschendal**

Situated in the original cellar of the Boschendal Manor House, the restaurant serves delectable Cape-French buffet luncheons, every day of the week. Your experience of Cape hospitality begins in the reception area where guests are welcomed with a glass of sherry or grape juice and the most magnificent display of fresh Proteas. The arrangement incorporates a wide variety of these unusual blooms, which are all picked on the farm. Slightly elevated from the reception area is the Boschendal Restaurant where the atmosphere is harmonious; air-conditioned in the summer and warmed in our mild winter. The yellow wood tables groan under the weight of eye catching, mouth-watering dishes which are expertly prepared by the kitchen brigade. These tantalising treats are perfectly complemented by Boschendal's finest

wines. Included in the Winelist are descriptions of the more than twenty local cheeses presented on the cheese table. Complemented with fresh and dried fruit and preserves we suggest you try the "French way" and enjoy your cheese before moving on to the sinful desserts.

Seidelberg

"A little bit of heaven in the winelands" was how one visitor to our historic Wine Estate summarized his experience. Established in 1692 under the name "De Leuwen Jagt" - Dutch for "The lion hunt" - Seidelberg Wine Estate builds on over 300 years of tradition by delighting visitors from around the world with its unique, handcrafted wines as well as a host of other attractions. Both our Seidelberg and De Leuwen Jagt ranges of wines are sold with pride in 15 countries and have won numerous local and international awards. A guided tour through our cellars gives visitors a glimpse of how the marriage between centuries of tradition and modern techniques combine to produce the magic that is Seidelberg wine.

Vrede & Lust

Vrede en Lust is a modern wine farm, building on a 315 year old foundation. Our vision is to become one of South Africa's best loved wineries by delivering a level of customer experience that exceeds all expectations. Vrede en Lust was established by the French Huguenot, Jacques de Savoye in 1688. De Savoye immediately started improving the 60 morgen (55 Ha) of land that starts on the Berg River Valley floor and runs up the eastern foothills of the majestic Simonsberg mountain. More than 10,000 vines were planted by 1691, which grew to 80,000 by 1780.

As a surprise, guests will return to the city via helicopter.

DINNER: Castle of Good Hope – Gala Dinner

The Castle of Good Hope is the oldest surviving building in South Africa. Built between 1666 and 1679, this pentagonal fortification replaced a small fort of timber and clay built by Commander Jan van Riebeeck in 1652 upon establishing a maritime replenishment station at the Cape of Good Hope for the Dutch East Indian Company or better known as the VOC (Verenigde Oost-Indische Compagnie) Today, the Castle of Good Hope house the regional headquarters of the South African Army in the Western Cape, the famous William Fehr Collection of historic artworks, the Castle Military Museum and ceremonial facilities for traditional Cape Regiments.

The Castle offer the perfect setting an selection of Banqueting rooms for the special Gala Dinner

Day 7

The guests will be at leisure for the whole day until they are ready for departure to the Airport.

We suggest the following activities:

Township Tour

This tour is very much an interactive experience. Guests visit 3 community projects where guests have a chance to chat to the locals and purchase goods that have been handmade. All of the projects are specific self-help projects that over the years have seen unskilled and uneducated men & women learn skills and a trade that then enables them to earn a living. The inclusion of tourism into the townships has been of great benefit to the communities as this has created employment and entrepreneurial opportunities for the locals. Through these visits to the townships the communities are involved in tourism as opposed to otherwise being left on the periphery. The tour is "food for thought", as despite the poverty, the power of the community and the spirit of enterprise shines through, leaving one with a feeling of hope.

Robben Island

For nearly 400 years, Robben Island, 12 kilometres from Cape Town, was a place of banishment, exile, isolation and imprisonment. It was here that rulers sent those they regarded as political troublemakers, social outcasts and the unwanted of society. Those imprisoned on the Island succeeded on a psychological and political level in turning a prison 'hell-hole' into a symbol of freedom and

personal liberation. Robben Island came to symbolise, not only for South Africa and the African continent, but also for the entire world, the triumph of the human spirit over enormous hardship and adversity. Sail for 30 minutes on the Robben Island ferry, then join a tour of the prison and the island. The guides are former prisoners from earlier days.

Golf

The Cape Town golf courses are a reflection of the dynamic and varying aspects of Cape Town. With views of the sand, the sea or the mountain from Cape Town's expansive greens, we're almost certain that you will thoroughly enjoy your golfing in Cape Town.

Shopping

Cape Town is ideal for shopping, whether looking for an important gift, a specialty item, a souvenir or a simple everyday item. Furthermore, Cape Town is known for its markets. When going to a market such as a craft market or flea market there are always bargains to be found. It's often the unexpected item or "treasures" sold at these markets which make shopping there worthwhile.

We suggest a farewell function prior to departure. Guests will meet at the hotel prior to departure and will then be transferred to the Airport afterwards.

The coach will pick the group up at the hotel for the transfer to Cape Town Airport and their departure flight.
